

Oral Statement 45h session of the Human Rights Council Item 2 General Debate

As rightly stated by the UN Secretary General¹ – I quote: "The pandemic has shown us who is doing the work that really matters: nurses, teachers, care workers. As we recover, we need to remember this. It is time to end the inequities of unpaid care work and create new economic models that work for everyone"- end quote.

We at MMM fully agree but place MOTHERS alongside teachers, nurses and care workers. Mothers have also played a key role in keeping their children, families and communities together. The crisis has shown what really matters: It has all been about care and education, and the people performing these duties. Whether paid or unpaid, they must be better recognized and supported.

The Covid-19 crisis gives us a unique opportunity to "build back better" and it starts with our economy. We MUST move away from an economy that prioritizes GDP growth and profit-making over the wellbeing of people and the planet. Instead we must design a new caring economic model that values, recognizes and enables the conditions for us all to care and be cared for².

A few governments have started to move to a "wellbeing economy" and are showing us the way³.

We call on the UN and member States to support such a shift by establishing a new platform to discuss indicators to replace GDP and to drive us towards a caring new economic model.
