With 25 years devoted to sustainability and systemic change, Céline Charveriat's journey spans academia to global campaigns. At Oxfam, she led initiatives on inequality, climate, and conflict, making waves with groundbreaking campaigns. She

has also been Executive Director of the Institute for European Environmental Policy, a sustainability think tank where she spearheaded strategic planning efforts leading to the creation of Think Sustainable Europe (TSE) and Think2030. Having been Chair of the Board within Climate Action Network (CAN) Europe and now Climate Catalyst, she continues to drive strategic planning processes aimed at catalysing impactful change. Currently, Céline Charveriat serves as the Director of Prototopia and also holds the position of adjunct professor at the Paris School of International Affairs (PSIA). Recently, she contributed to the work of a high-level group of the European Commission on innovation, notably offering insights into transforming education during polycrisis situations. Olivier De Schutter is professor at UCLouvain and SciencesPo, and he taught in the past at Columbia University, at UC Berkeley, and at Yale University. He was the UN Special Rapporteur on right to food between 2008 and 2014, and a Member of the UN Committee on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights between 2015 and 2020. He is currently co-chair of the International Panel of Experts on Sustainable Food Systems (IPES-Food) and the UN Special Rapporteur on extreme poverty and human rights.

Shahnaz is a well-known figure in British and Middle Eastern media through her work with the BBC and ITN including, Arab World Direct, Tomorrow's World and Channel Four News. Her news presentations have included high profile interviews with

international leaders in government and business. Shahnaz also produced and presented her own weekly women's programme Everywoman for Al Jazeera International. With women's issues at its core, the show covered a range of topics including social impact, entrepreneurship, religion, gender equality, education and the arts. This was a first-of-its-kind programming which paved the way for many other 'pro-women' channels. Shahnaz founded her own media company SP productions which undertakes filmmaking, MCing, events management and overall communications consultancy.
